Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act-Proposition 65 The Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act (CPSIA)

<u>Product(s) Description</u>: SharperBags™ Plastic Bags

To Whom It May Concern;

California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (Proposition 65):

Please be advised that the SharperBags plastic bags are not formulated with any of the chemicals listed in the California Proposition 65 Act and are produced using raw materials that comply with the requirements of the Act. This product is therefore not subject to the warning requirements stipulated in the Act.

Further, the inks used to imprint the bags contain no toxic air contaminants as defined in the California Toxic Air Contaminants list or in the Federal Hazardous Air Pollutants list. In addition, the inks used meet the requirements of the Nordic Sawn ecolabel for use on printed matter. The Swan criteria include requirements as to chemicals, emission to air and water, and waste treatment. Further, the inks used comply with the Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants and the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer and contain no California Proposition 65 ingredients.

The Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act (CPSIA):

Regarding the Consumer Product Safety Act and Child Safety, the SharperBags plastic bags are not required to contain a suffocation warning label as all of the bags are 2 and 3 mil in thickness which is greater than the 1 mil thickness threshold required for warnings imprinted on the products. Warning labels may be printed on the bags based on individual customer requests.
